Assessor Prang and BOE Member Horton Offer Tax Relief Resources to Empower Community Service Organizations

LOS ANGELES – Los Angeles County Assessor Jeffrey Prang, together with California State Board of Equalization Member Jerome E. Horton and Faith And Community Empowerment (FACE), hosted a Nonprofit Empowerment Symposium and Expo on Friday, June 29, 2018 at West LA College. Representatives of more than 300 nonprofit organizations attended the free event, which offered tax-saving resources as well as vital information on affordable housing, home ownership, and foreclosure prevention.

“I am thrilled to be joining with Board Member Horton and our partners and panelists in offering the information and resources that nonprofit organizations rely upon to serve the people of Los Angeles County,” Assessor Prang said. “These faith-based and community service organizations play a vital role in service to our communities; the tools we provide will assist them in their respective missions.”
