L.A. COUNTY'S FORMER CHIEF DEPUTY ASSESSOR, A STEADY LEADER IN A TUMULTUOUS TIME, HAS DIED

LOS ANGELES, CA – Former Los Angeles County Chief Deputy Assessor Sharon Moller, known for her steady leadership during a critical and tumultuous time in the history of the Assessor's Office, has passed away.

Moller began her 25-year tenure with the Office of the Assessor as a Real Property Appraiser Trainee and retired in 2015 as the highest-ranking female executive to lead the Office. She died on Friday, November 9, 2018.

Los Angeles County Assessor Jeffrey Prang and his Office are mourning the passing of this dedicated leader. "Sharon served Los Angeles County residents with incredible pride, dignity, and commitment," Assessor Prang shared. "She became particularly known for her highly specialized knowledge and understanding of complex hotel valuations and appraisals."

"The Assessor's Office not only relied heavily on Sharon's appraisal expertise, but also on her ability to mentor staff and provide leadership to her colleagues," Prang continued.

Moller was the first female executive to attain the rank of Chief Deputy Assessor in the history of Los Angeles County's Office of the Assessor. She was admired for her stewardship of the nation's largest local property tax assessment agency in the country, especially as it worked to regain the public's trust in their ability to process fair and accurate assessments.

"Sharon worked tirelessly to improve services for taxpayers of Los Angeles County and left an indelible imprint on this Office. She will be missed," stated Prang.
